Chipola College hosted the first (1961) and last thirteen (1996-2008) State JUCO Tournaments. This year, Chipola will host the Men's and Women's State Tournaments on March 4-7, 2009.

The record of men's tournament winners shows why the Panhandle Conference is considered the toughest in the state and the nation.

Of 48 state tournaments, Panhandle teams(*) have won 23. Of the 23, Chipola has won eleven, the largest number of wins of any college in the state.

Pensacola has won five state championships and won the national championship in 1993. Okaloosa-Walton has won three state tournaments— and in 1995 went on to win the national championship. Chipola finished second in the national tournament in 2007.

Fans have suggested that Panhandle teams wear themselves out playing each other before they get to the state tournament. Rumor has it that both Pensacola and Okaloosa-Walton found the national tournament easier to win than the Panhandle Conference championship.

The Women's State Championship was joined with the men's state championship in 1997. Both tournaments have been hosted by Chipola College ever since (1997-2008). This year, Chipola will host the Men's and Women's State Tournaments on March 4-7, 2009.

The record of women's tournament winners shows why the Panhandle Conference is considered the toughest in the state and the nation.

Of 38 state tournaments, Panhandle teams(*) have won 15. Out of the last 16 years, the Panhandle conference has won 14 championships and have won the last eleven consecutive years. Chipola won its first state championship in 2005 and continued to garner three back-to-back championships.

Gulf Coast has won seven state championships and won the national title in 2003 and 2008. Gulf Coast is the only Florida team to win the title since 1990.
