### About this Schedule SUMMER II, 2010

#### Class Periods

- Regular class periods on Monday through Thursday are 50 minutes long with ten minutes between the end of one period and the beginning of the next. A few classes meet 75 minutes. There are extended class periods for courses scheduled on Fridays depending on the number of credit hours.
- Classes scheduled to begin later than 4 p.m. vary in length depending upon the credit involved, the nature of the course, and the number of meetings per week. Unless laboratory or similar activities are involved, evening classes meet 50 minutes per week for each semester hour of credit.
- Laboratory or similar activities will involve 100 minutes or more per week per semester hour.
- The 10-10:50 a.m. period on Wednesdays is reserved as an Activity Period—a time for organizations and intramurals to meet.
- Times shown are Central Standard.
- Any course listed with the section 400 or 700 are distance learning courses.

Prior to the first week of classes, students taking any Distance Learning classes will receive a letter from Chipola with instructions on how to access coursework through the d21 system. Students should review the syllabus which will provide information regarding any instructional materials (such as the textbook or any other software required) and an overview of the d21 course content as well as the name, telephone number, and e-mail address of the instructor.

- Every effort will be made to offer the classes listed in this schedule; it may be necessary to cancel or otherwise modify classes under certain conditions if the demand as indicated by registration does not justify teaching the course(s).

Courses other than those shown may be offered if the demand justifies the offering and qualified instructors are available.

- Although notes concerning some courses are shown, the college catalog should be consulted for course prerequisites, corequisites, descriptions and transferability code.
- Classes are listed alphabetically by major discipline areas and within each major discipline area.

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# DISTANCE LEARNING COURSES

The purpose of Chipola College Distance Learning is to provide accessible, affordable, quality educational opportunities for area citizens through the use of technology. The college is committed to delivering instruction to students who are separated from their instructor by time and space, and providing high quality course offerings to students who cannot regularly attend campus classes and complete coursework by traditional methods. However, students enrolled in these courses may be required to take examinations on campus (or under the supervision of an approved proctor, that is, someone authorized by Chipola to conduct these tests) on the dates specified in the syllabus for each course. Course syllabus and assignments will be available online on Chipola College's eLearning Desire2Learn (d2l) system. Students taking a Distance Learning class must meet the placement testing and admissions requirements of the college. All college policies and deadlines apply. Coursework should be completed during the term it begins. Students must register

during the registration dates listed in the college calendar. Students enrolled in any Distance Learning classes will receive a letter from Chipola with instructions on how to access coursework through the d2l system. During the first week of classes, students must log in to the Chipola College Distance Learning Orientation at [www.chipola.edu/DistanceLearning/index.htm](http://www.chipola.edu/DistanceLearning/index.htm). Students should review the syllabus which will provide information regarding any instructional materials (such as the textbook or any other software required) and an overview of the d2l course content as well as the name, telephone number, and e-mail address of the instructor. Because a Distance Learning class has course materials online, students are expected to have an understanding of Internet basics and access to fast speed Internet. The Technology Center on the second level of the Library is equipped with 32 Internet workstations. These workstations are available to Chipola College students who present a current college ID. ## WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

To enter a Workforce Development certificate program or class, contact the instructor by calling (850) 718-2270. Several programs do not require a high school diploma. You may attend classes full or part-time or during the evenings. For program and course descriptions, see the catalog. With the exception of Cosmetology, programs listed here are self-paced, open-entry/open-exit courses. This means that you may enter a program any time during the year that space is available. When you complete all the required course work and competencies and are recommended by your instructor, you will be awarded your certificate,

whether or not you have completed the total average number of clock hours listed for the program. State rules require all students entering WFD programs to take the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE). Depending upon your scores, you may spend part of your time working in the Success Center to improve your basic skills. Cosmetology and Public Service have limited enrollments, so you must make arrangements to enter them, months in advance. Also, Public Service has special entrance requirements, grading systems, attendance policies and dress codes.
